Police Meeting Anti social behaviour

The meeting was extremely well attended with over 70 local residents, our 3 ward Councillors and 3 Representatives from Merseyside Police (Neighbourhood Inspector Bob Daly, Constable Steve McGhee and PCSO Phil Cooper).

We will keep you informed of any progress in our next newsletter.

Neighbourhood Renewal Fund

Following requests from residents, our ward Councillors have made an application on behalf of SARA to the Neighbourhood Renewal Fund for dropped kerbs along Aigburth Road. A number of roads between Ashfield Road and Woodlands Road were adapted a few years ago; we have requested that this be extended to include Aigburth Vale and roads between Chermside Road and Dundonald Road. This should provide straight through access from Sefton Park to Dundonald Road.

The Chairman of SARA was invited to attend the second AGM of Kelton Park Residents' Association (KPRA). The event which took place on Monday 24th September was well attended by residents of Kelton Park and representatives of Contour Homes.

SARA WORKING WITH MERSEYSIDE POLICE

As part of my last update, I mentioned the work done within Mossley Hill Ward through our Key Individual Network (KIN) Group. This group meets every three months to examine local problems and identifies KIN Priorities which Neighbourhood officers focus on in partnership with our Partner Agencies and Local Community Groups and Representatives. We have also encouraged the involvement of members of the Local Community and we have continued to be well supported by Local Ward Councillors.

During the past several months, we have been concentrating on the following current KIN Priorities.

Anti-social Behaviour - Sudley Field

Anti-social Behaviour - Aigburth Vale

Anti-social Behaviour - Holt Field

Speeding Vehicles - Aigburth Road/Jericho Lane

Parking - Mossley Hill Road

Anti-social Behaviour - There have been two Section 30 Dispersal Areas in place within the Mossley Hill Ward in recent months. Details as follows:-

Mersey Road Area - commenced on 1/4/07 until 30/9/07

Aigburth Vale Area - commenced on 3/7/07 until 1/10/07

Both orders have just expired. An assessment has been conducted of the Mersey Road Order, which shows that 7.4% reduction in overall incidents of Anti-social Behaviour. Although there has been an increase of 23% in incidents of rowdy behaviour. There has been a 30% decrease in overall crime in the area. During the period of the order, there has been

There have also been 26 Formal Warnings administered for possession of cannabis. An assessment of the Aigburth Vale Order is still pending. We held a Public Meeting at SARA Hall on Thursday 23rd August 2007, which was also attended by Local Ward Councillors. The following action has been taken to address the issues raised at the meeting:-

Speeding in Mersey Road and Sudley Road - The Speed Indicator Display (SID) Device has been deployed to both locations to monitor speeds. Aigburth Road, Aigburth Hall Avenue, Jericho Lane, Sudley Road, Mersey Road and Holmefield Road have also been targeted. The Area Roadsafe Team has been targeting Aigburth Road for speeding enforcement.

Parking in Donalds Way and Dundonald Road - Leaflets advising parents to park considerately have been distributed to parents dropping off children at Sudley Junior School. Extra attention has continued to be given in the area. The activity of an ice cream seller parking in Dundonald Road has been monitored by PCSO's and on those occasions no offences have been disclosed. Although this matter still remains ongoing.

Kelton Grange - Residents raised concerns at the state of the building and the youths that are damaging it. There is a security guard at the site and the Dedicated Police Officer has liaised with the Local Authority regarding the property in conjunction with Ashbury Homes who own the building. The plans for the building are still being considered by the Local Authority.

Youth Diversionary Activities - PCSO's organised a series of youth activities at SARA Hall and St Margarets School over the Summer Holiday period and residents asked if these activities were to be repeated in the future. It is intended to run similar events in the future probably commencing in the New Year to coincide with the School Holiday period.

It's nice to know that we have support from the general public back home. I would especially like to return my thanks as I am from Liverpool and I know how kind scousers can be.

The surgical ward is a 20 bed medical facility within the hospital, we receive all trauma casualties and non-trauma casualties, unfortunately during my tour out here we have been very busy so when we receive parcels it really does give the injured soldiers a boost for the day. I deployed out on telic in May so we only have one month left out here then there will be a huge change over of the regiments and support arms. The staffing on the ward is a mixture of officers, cpl's and pte's and then there is me, the only senior rank.

We have all had a very rewarding tour out here nursing the injured back to health, most of us are looking forward now to returning home to spend Christmas with our families and friends and having a well earned rest. I can't thank you enough for the parcels, they really do make a difference.
