A History of Liverpool Theatres and Cinemas

Richard Baker gave a very amusing and informative talk on old theatres and cinemas of Liverpool at SARA Hall on Friday 5th March. It triggered many happy memories for people in the audience and had them reminiscing about the old days. We hadn't realised that theatre in Liverpool started in 1567 at The Cockpit Yard Theatre in Moor Street and progressed from then on to our lovely theatres of present day. He also told us of another Liverpool "first". Seemingly at the Royal Court Theatre people for the first time were made to form what we now know as a queue. This came about because the sailors who wanted access to entertainment at the theatre would barge in and upset the regular patrons. The management erected barriers and they were made to file into the theatre in an orderly manner. The term queue comes from the French word cue for the pigtail sported by many seamen in those days.

Commemoration of Aigburth Men who Fell in the Great War of 1914-1918

I am Richard Daglish and I have been researching local men who died in the Great War. There are three lists of names that I am aware of: in St Anne's Church, on the outer wall of Aigburth Methodist Church, and at Aigburth People's Hall. The last-named has been in private hands after the closure of the Hall. I have looked into some of the background of these men and can provide details on request.

The following list is of Aigburth men, not named on those memorials and have been traced through searching the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Debt of Honour Register. The entries follow the CWGC's method: name, rank, unit/service, age and date of death. I would be most interested to hear from anyone who thinks that they have a connection to those listed and would be pleased to let them have any further information I have and to add to my research with any information they can provide. Charitable Giving at SARA

The final round of the Youth Recognition Awards closed on 31st January.
