Ash Surgery Update

Firstly, it should be noted that all proposed developments regarding the relocation of the Ash Surgery are at a very early stage of discussion and it will be approximately 2 years before any move is finalised. For the surgery to be included in these discussions, it was necessary for them to express an interest in one of the proposed sites by the end of May. Carol Reid, Practice Manager of the Ash Surgery, has confirmed that they have expressed an interest in a site at Booker Avenue.

The South Liverpool Primary Care Trust are investigating the possibility of acquiring land at Booker Avenue although the site has not yet been approved for future healthcare buildings and no plans have been drawn up. A formal consultation process will be undertaken by the South Liverpool PCT with all stakeholders/interested parties prior to any move. Details of the scheme will be presented to the South Liverpool PCT Board in September 2006.

The surgery is currently undertaking a questionnaire, copies of which can be obtained from the practice.

Kelton Grange

Kelton Grange Nursing Home is closing within the next twelve months if not before.

The Residents families are fighting the closure. The 28 bedded nursing home has been in the present purpose built home for fifteen years having moved over from the 'Big House' Old Kelton when the Nugent Care Society took over from the Sisters of the Sacred Heart. The Residents of Kelton Grange will all have to be found new homes. The old building, part of which is listed, is derelict at the moment and people are wondering what will become of it and the Kelton Grange site? We will keep you informed of developments.

Sudley House Update

Sudley House is undergoing major changes which will provide greater levels of access to all. The house will benefit from a new lift installation to give access to the upper level galleries.

When the doors re-open in 2007, the original Victorian grandeur of Sudley House will be evident in the original historic interiors of the ground floor and the fabulous Art Collection of George Holt will once again grace the walls of the house. Artwork includes works by Gainsborough, Turner, Reynolds and Landseer.

There will be an introductory display providing visitors with the history of Sudley House and a new learning area will provide groups and schools with the opportunity to see what goes on behind the scenes at Sudley House and to hear more about the Family, the Sudley Estate and the Collection.

The biggest areas of change to Sudley House will be the introduction of a Temporary Exhibition Gallery and a Historic Costume and Fashion Gallery. This will give Sudley the ability to change displays more than ever before. The first Historic Costume display will be based on a collection of clothes from the Holland Family, former residents of Carnatic Hall which was situated next to the Sudley Estate and is now home to Liverpool University Halls of Residence.

There's exciting developments at Sudley House for children, two new childhood rooms will open on the upper floor and child friendly activities throughout the house will provide an interesting and friendly environment.

Thanks to Robin Emmerson, Curator of Decorative Art at National Museums Liverpool for taking time to talk to S.A.R.A. about these great developments at Sudley.



Adult Learnin

LOOKING BACK

Since last September SARA Hall has hosted a wide-ranging programme of learning opportunities for adults. Changes in the way adult education is funding severely restricted the free programme offer from Knowsley Community College through its L.I.N.C. programme. Only two courses started in the autumn. On Wednesday mornings a First Aid course initially attracted only a small but enthusiastic group. However, a few new students were recruited for the Health Awareness module which started at Faster.

A much larger group have enjoyed the computer sessions on Friday mornings with some students taking the new C.L.A.I.T (Computer Literacy and Information Technology) accreditation.

In February the Workers' Educational Association (WEA) booked the Hall to run a fee paying Painting class. So impressed was the WEA with the facilities at the Hall that they subsequently offered a couple of other classes - Digital Photography and Local History. Both courses proved popular. On this occasion the courses were offered free to the students as tasters. A programme of fee-paying courses will be on offer from September.





As well as courses offered by adult education providers, Phillipa Bellis has independently continued her Yoga classes on Wednesday evenings and the Liverpool Tai Chi Club has met on Thursday evenings. Two Craft groups have continued to meet without the services of a tutor. On Wednesday afternoons a group make greetings cards and a larger and more general craft class meet on Thursday mornings. There is also an opportunity to learn a few new steps at the weekly Tea Dance held on Tuesdays and family swimming sessions at I.M. Marsh are run on Wednesdays from 7.00 – 9.00 pm.

All in all a varied and lively programme of learning has taken place over the year and hopefully this will continue and develop this autumn.

A Coffee Morning and Recruitment Session will be held on Wednesday 16 August 2006 from 10.30 am to 1.00 pm. This will be an opportunity to discuss the autumn programme of courses with representatives of Knowsley Community College and the WEA. The programme of courses cannot be confirmed unless there is sufficient interest so please do try to come along. Did You Know?

THE HISTORY OF SCOUSE

Scouse was brought to Liverpool by Northern European sailors, it was originally called Labskause. This was finally shortened to Skause and over time the spelling changed to the more Anglicised version we have today, scouse.

The people who ate scouse were generally sailors and their families and eventually all sailors within Liverpool were referred to as Scousers. Time has now taken its turn and everyone from the region of Liverpool is known as a Scouser.

Scouse holds a place in the heart of most Liverpudlians as the taste of their home town and is still regularly eaten today by a great number of families.

There are records showing that it was also served to the inmates of the Birkenhead workhouse way back in 1864. The recipe was much simpler then than today's refined version but was predominantly the same staple ingredients – meat, vegetables and potatoes.

Blind scouse was a variation on the recipe and was eaten by the poorer people as it was cheaper to make because it did not contain meat.

Recipe - CHICKEN AND MOZZARELLA

This is a versatile recipe that can be adjusted to suit your particular taste. The chicken can be cooked in a variety of ways and either full fat or half fat cheese can be used.

Ingredients for 2 people

2 Skinless Chicken breasts Mozzarella Cheese (Full fat or half-fat) Olive Oil (optional)

Tin of chopped plum tomatoes Dried Oregano (2 dessertspoons)

Bake, fry or grill the chicken breasts. Heat the tin of tomatoes (add a dash of olive oil if you want to give the dish an Italian touch). Stir in the oregano. When cooked, place the chicken breasts on plates add 2 slices of mozzarella cheese to each then spoon the hot tomatoes over the top. Serve with warm Chiabatta bread and a glass of red or white wine – delicious!

It is always a pleasure to write about good news. Crime has fallen in the last twelve months by impressive amounts in Mossley Hill. Robbery has reduced by 55%, burglary by 38%, theft of motor vehicles by 46% and criminal damage by 12%. I am particularly proud of my team and our partners in Neighbourhood management under Chris Peach in achieving these results and the efforts they make to improve the quality of working life.

Youth disorder is always a concern during the summer holidays. It is not something that will ever go away completely. Young people tend to move locations on a regular basis. I am aware of some problems around the Rose Lane area, which we have addressed. If you are experiencing problems let us know, we will call and speak to you and tackle the problems.

I would like to bring to your attention one nationally emerging crime problem. The theft of satellite navigation systems from cars. It is not a problem around Mossley Hill at the moment but please be aware they are attractive to thieves. Don't leave them on display and wipe away the marks from the windscreen.


