The Ancient Chapel of Toxteth

You have probably passed the Ancient Chapel at the bottom of Park Road, but may not realise what a fascinating history it has and how many prominent people are buried there.

The Chapel dates back to about 1618, when Park Road was just a track within the royal hunting park of Toxteth. The land came into the possession of Sir Richard Molyneux, from the Crown via the Earl of Derby, and Molyneux, although himself a Catholic, allowed a settlement of Puritans who were escaping religious persecution. This community first built a schoolhouse for the children and appointed Richard Mather from Warrington as the schoolmaster although he was only 13 years old! He left to study at Oxford; meanwhile the Chapel was built and Mather returned as Minister. But the Puritans were still subject to ever-increasing persecution and Richard Mather eventually sailed to America with the Pilgrim Fathers.

One significant member of this congregation was Jeremiah Horrox, who lived at the Lower Lodge in Toxteth Park and at the age of 20, was the first person to predict and observe the transit of Venus across the sun, and calculated the distance from the earth to the sun. There is a monument to him in the Chapel and he is believed to be buried there. (There is also an attractive mosaic commemorative plaque to him in the central reservation of Horrocks Avenue, Garston).

Many notable names are to be seen in the graveyard, including members of the Holt and Rathbone families: George Holt senior was a cotton broker who married Emma Durning, from another prominent Liverpool family; his son George junior founded the Blue Funnel Line, and brother Alfred was an engineer who became wealthy enough to buy Sudley House. William Rathbone was Liberal MP for Liverpool in 1868, and his daughter Eleanor also became an MP. Members of the Melly family are also buried there, ancestors of the entertainer George Melly; his great-uncle Charles Melly was a great benefactor for the poor – an example of this is the provision of taps and drinking fountains at docks and railway stations, at his own expense, in response to the requests of poor Irish immigrants for clean drinking water. George Melly's grandparents are understood to have lived in the area of St Michaels in the Hamlet.
