The Turner Prize will be presented in the Tate Liverpool this year, during the cities 800th birthday celebrations.

Renowned as one of the the art world's most prestigious and controvercial exhibitions, it will feature work from four of the shortlisted British Artists at the Tate Liverpool, Albert Dock.

This will be the first time that the exhibition will have taken place outside of London since its launch in 1984.

Winners in the past have included Tracey Emin and Damien Hirst, famous for their controversial art.

## A Year of Celebration, Liverpool's 800th

As almost everyone in Liverpool is aware, the city celebrates its 800th birthday this year. Starting very modestly as a small trading port, Liverpool soon flourished and as time progressed and trading expanded globally, it was perfectly sited to become one of the world's most prosperous and famous cities. Trade and ship building, industry and commerce, sport and music, Liverpool has had it all over the last eight hundred years.

The city has boasted many famous names too, from Prime Ministers to Pop Stars, but arguably it is the people themselves and the "Scouse" hearty personality which shines above all.

The birthday celebrations planned by the city include a four-day party extravaganza over the August Bank Holiday, to mark the granting of Liverpool's first charter, by King John on August 28th 1207.

Events planned include street parties - communities will be offered free party kits; the annual Matthew Street Music Festival (Fri-Mon, 24th-27th August); 800th birthday civic service; a historical pageant and procession like the 700th anniversary celebrations in 1907; public festivities on 28th August, midday to 3pm; the birthday finale: Europe's largest fireworks display.

## Changes to the SARA Committee

On Wednesday 10th January 2007, the SARA Committee adopted a revised version of the Constitution. The objects of SARA remain unchanged but there have been a number of changes to how the association is managed.

The Executive Committee have formed a new Board of Trustees and 2 of the officer roles have changed. Peter Urmston retired from the position of Chairman which he has held for a number of years, he will continue on the board as a Trustee and a valued member of the S.A.R.A. management. Steven Kearney has assumed the chairman's position and the secretary position he leaves has been filled by Dot Caples.

# The Empowering Neighbourhoods Scheme (TENS) Alleygates

In conjunction with our ward councillors, SARA recently applied for funding of £14,150 from the TENS initiative to help fund some of the much needed alleygates in the area. This would provide the funds to gate one alley with 4 sets of gates and also includes a charge of £2,100 to provide the designated area with a gating order which grants the legal permissions to install the gates for the alley.

SARA were awarded the sum of £5,933 which, although not enough to complete the project, has enabled us to apply for the gating order. With the help of our ward councillors, we hope to be able to source the remaining funds.

We would love to be in a position to apply for the funding necessary to assist with the remaining alleygate requirements for the Sudley area but with such high costs, this clearly isn't possible. We therefore ask our residents to continue lobbying your ward councillors and MP for help in this matter.

## Sudley House Volunteer Reminiscence Guides

It has been announced that Sudley House is to re-open on 26th May.

## Crofton Estate Planning Application

A number of public meetings have been held at SARA Hall regarding planning proposals at Crofton Estate. We can now report back that an application has been registered with Liverpool City Council Planning Department from Darby Macy Developments.

The application is to extend, alter and convert Crofton into 12 flats, to extend and convert stables into 2 dwellings, to erect 6 dwellings adjacent to Dundonald Road, to erect 3 dwellings at rear of Sudley Grange, to erect new lodge adjacent to North Sudley Road, to extend Crofton Mews and continue to use as a single dwelling and continue to use Crofton Lodge, Brookfield Cottage and Crofton Cottage as single dwellings along with associated landscaping works, car and cycle parking and bin storage provision.

## Smart Bus Service

From 15th April, the Smart service from Aigburth Vale is being replaced. The Smart service will commence and terminate at Brunswick Station and no longer run between Brunswick Station and Aigburth Vale.

The new 48a service operating from Southport-Liverpool City Centre (James Street)-John Lennon Airport will be covering a similar route to the Smart Service although the service will no longer cover Ashfield Road or Aigburth Vale (61 Bus Stop).

SARA have written to Merseytravel and Arriva to raise concerns over the loss of the existing service, Arriva appreciate that changes to services may cause inconvenience to some passengers and apologise for this but they advise the decision was made following a review of services, these changes will offer improved frequencies and the restoration of an evening service. The frequency will be 20 minutes Monday to Saturday daytime and 30 minutes evenings and Sundays.

## Merseymart - no deliveries to Dundonald Road and Donalds Way.

A number of residents have asked SARA to enquire with the Merseymart office regarding non-receipt of the free weekly newspaper. We have spoken with the Merseymart who advise that Dundonald Road and Donalds Way have been removed from the circulation list. SARA have written to the Merseymart asking if this can be re-instated. We will keep you informed.

## SARA WORKING WITH MERSEYSIDE POLICE

As the summer approaches three things often start to happen. Drivers' speeds increase, opportunity burglaries increase and anti-social behaviour increases. Some of you will have seen a speed indicator display we have attached to a lamp post in Woodlands Road. This not only tells the driver the speed they are travelling at, it also provides a graph of speeds and times. We use this analysis to target the worst offenders at the most appropriate time.

If you feel your road would benefit please let us know and we will set the equipment up for you.

With regard to burglaries, this is not a specific problem in your area but be aware if you go out and leave windows open in the hot weather you increase the risk of burglaries taking place.

You will all be aware I am sure of the investment in Otterspool promenade and the work that is taking place to improve this site. The area has its own unique problems with regard to youth disorder and illegal sexual activity. We have an ongoing operation in the area to ensure the park is suitable for everyone to enjoy.

Please contact us if you have any concerns that you would like to discuss.

The two youth exclusion zones are in force in Aigburth Vale and Mersey Road, over thirty warnings were issued during the last weekend of March and four youths are being summoned for breaching the order. I am aware that large groups are continuing to gather and would ask that you contact us directly if this is happening near you.

## Holiday to Ostend

Bright and early on Sunday 11th March, 40+ travellers set off for Dover to make the crossing to Calais and then onwards to Ostend for a four-night stay. The journey was trouble free until we reached Ostend. We had difficulty actually reaching our hotel for two reasons, Ostend was in the middle of its own "Big Dig", which meant that the coach could not approach the hotel by its normal route, this with the crowds enjoying the unseasonal sunshine along the promenade made progress slow.

Eventually we got there and found the Royal Astor to be a very pleasant hotel with clean, spacious rooms. Over the period of our stay we also found the food to be plentiful so there was no cause for complaint on that score either. Entertainment was provided each evening for ourselves and the other coach parties staying at the hotel.

Monday was a "free" day in Ostend, giving those new to the city the opportunity to explore and those who had been there before, time to re-visit favourite haunts. The cathedral was well worth a visit, as too was the Marina. Shopping opportunities were plentiful and a visit to C & A Modes was a must (if only to remember with affection its days in Liverpool city centre).

On Tuesday we went to Sluis (a small Dutch border town) in the morning. This is a pretty place with a windmill, a stream and a clog making shop! Then it was on to Bruges - a very historic city built on canals. Parts of the city date back to medieval times and the city centre is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Bruges is famous for its lace which, though beautiful, is costly.

On Wednesday we travelled a little further afield to Ghent which is the capital and biggest city of the East Flanders province. It is a very busy port being connected to the sea by the Ghent-Terneuzen Canal. Much of the

city's medieval architecture remains intact and is remarkably well preserved and restored. Again, parts of the city have been recognised by



UNESCO as World Heritage Sites. On the way back from Ghent we made a stop at a chocolate factory and the photograph shows a group enjoying a refreshing ice cream in the brilliant sunshine.

Thursday saw us start the long journey home with a final continental stop, this time in France(!) at a hypermarket in Dunkirk to stock up on cheaper alcohol, then on to Calais and another smooth Channel crossing. How they do it, they're not telling, but our tour operators (Barbara and Eileen) were able to ensure not just an odd glimmer of sunshine but wall to wall, warm sunshine - in March. I wouldn't have believed it possible, only I was there!

Thanks are due not only to Barbara and Eileen for an excellent short break, but also to our unflappable driver, Frank - a very safe pair of hands indeed. The onboard raffle raised a very respectable £63 for Zoe's Place.

The Chairman and Secretary of SARA were delighted to accept an invitation to look around Sudley Infant School. The Head teacher, Ms. Thomas took time from a no doubt very busy day, to make us welcome. She talked to us about the school's ethos and drew attention to the school sign "Building Bright Futures". Judging by what we saw this is no vain aspiration. The whole feel of the school inspires confidence, from the way the children interact with the Head Teacher and her with her staff, to the music playing prior to lessons starting.

Ms. Thomas explained how, over time, the school had almost doubled its original capacity and while the school had been extended, her next project was to develop the old storage building as a classroom. The school views itself as very much a community and family school (they have a Grandparents Day!) and she invited SARA to consider holding a meeting in the school's wonderfully extended hall (it most certainly has the wow factor!). This might possibly attract some parents to SARA and its activities.

The school's approach to charity giving was interesting in as much as it fully involved the children at classroom level in their own particular charity rather than a single charity supported by the whole school. Charities also went into the school to collect the donations and by doing so each child became much more aware of where their money was going and why it was needed.

There was so much more that we gleaned from this visit which provided a real insight into modern schooling (not least the extensive use of IT in teaching). All in all a fascinating visit and hopefully we will be able to keep you informed of the school's activities as we have agreed to keep each other informed through our respective newsletters.

For over a hundred years Aigburth People's Hall in Aigburth Vale has been an important community resource for the people of the area. This members club provides a range of sporting and entertainment activities which are open to all. It is run by a voluntary committee that is currently struggling to balance the books due to falling membership, which has resulted in an under use of the clubs facilities.

The Club is open from 7 pm every weekday and from 1 pm on Saturday and Sunday. At weekends children are welcome (up to 9 pm) if accompanied by an adult.

A function room with bar facilities is available for hire at extremely competitive rates. This is ideal for birthday parties, weddings, funerals, christenings,

Alternatively, if you enjoy folk music, the Triton Folk Group may be for you - just turn up any Monday night.

The club boasts one of the best crown green bowling greens in Liverpool and there are many teams, for both men and women, playing throughout the

week. In addition the club is a pleasant alternative to your local for a quiet drink in convivial company, whatever your age. Why not give it a try? Come along and see what's on offer. Visitors are welcome anytime for a nominal entrance fee.

Membership is open to anyone over 18 years of age and costs a very reasonable £15 per annum (£13 for pensioners).
