Chair - Peter Urmston

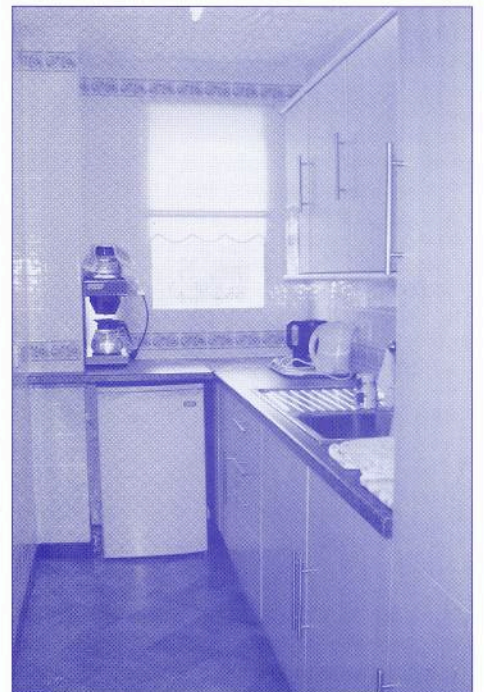
Secretary - Steven Kearney

Mobile Library Service

Liverpool City Council Libraries and information service has informed SARA that it is to cease its mobile library service to the Sudley area as and from the 30th of July 2005.

They have issued a statement offering alternative services:

"Elderly People and those with disabilities are entitled to a housebound reader service with regular visits to their own homes. Customers are welcome to use any of the other public library services in the city.

A list of libraries is available for your information.

Staff are happy to help and advise you regarding the availability of convenient alternative library services."

SARA are disappointed with this sudden decision by Liverpool City Council. There are many people within our community who cannot travel easily to a library and who found the mobile service ideal.

What does the Council propose to do to provide a housebound reader service?

History

Liverpool Cricket Club

Liverpool Cricket Club is almost two hundred years old, the present site on Aigburth Road being completed in 1881. Many memorable cricket matches have been played here with sides such as Australia, New Zealand and the West Indies. Players such as Don Bradman, Frank Worrell and W.R. Hammond have all graced the cricket ground.

To coincide with our 200 years, we hope a published history will be compiled. If any newsletter readers have photographs, documents or memories of the club, we would be very grateful to receive them.

On the sporting side, league cricket, bowls, rugby, hockey, squash and tennis are played at the club with the chance of a sauna afterwards. Most sports are also played socially and youth coaching at all ages is heavily subscribed to, with many participants. Table tennis has recently arrived as a sport and we wish the players here every success.

As with similar establishments we use our facilities to the maximum by hiring out sports surfaces and indoor locations to the public, other clubs and societies. In the capable hands of resident steward/stewardess John and Sue Perry, most types of functions are catered for. The addition of an outdoor verandah with comfortable chairs and tables makes sitting outside in warm weather a pleasure added to by magnificent views of the Welsh mountains across the river. Recently teams have been coming to play bowls at the club for a day out and a meal afterwards, this we hope will develop.

Last year a series of marquees were erected with a self contained kitchen, three functions were held at which some nine hundred people dined, wine and were entertained. Twice a wee quiz nights are held with a mini bingo at one. It's also possible to loose weight and learn Spanish at classes held here.

Word Facts

Sabotage

The word *Sabotage* is directly linked with a word for a heavy wooden clog, "*Sabot*". Both words are French in origin: "*Sabot*", a much older word, entered English in the 17th century; *Sabotage* was not adopted until the early 20th century. *Sabotage* comes from the verb *Saboter*, meaning "*willfully destroy*", originally "*kick or strike with Sabots*".

It was first used in English in the context of industrial action, in reference to the wilful destruction of their employer's property by workmen during a strike.

Pavilion Pre-School - Aigburth

The "playgroup" was originally formed by six local mums in 1969, to provide pre-school activities for the under 5's in the area, and used the Liverpool Cricket Club as their base for approximately nine years. The Woodlands Tennis club situated on Dundonald Road then rented out a building on their site to the group (the present site) and the "Pavilion Playgroup" was formed.

The land on which the tennis courts were situated belonged to the Health Authority and in 1982 that land was put up for sale, drawing a lot of interest from property developers. After much heart ache and protests, the land was sold in 1984.

The secretary of the playgroup at the time, approached the new owner and explained the existence of the playgroup and the fact that there was no where for them to move to. Eventually it was decided by the property developer that a small portion of the site would be gifted to the playgroup on condition that that the Playgroup raised enough capital to provide a new portacabin for a premises and fencing for the boundary.

In 1984 £15,000 seemed a monumental task, but the playgroups succeeded and the result is the lovely site and facilities which exist now.

The Playgroup has always been organised and run by the parents whose children attend. This is achieved by way of a committee with monthly meetings. The requirements by social services state that a ratio of one adult per eight children over the age of 3 must be maintained. The group therefore has a rota, where parents take turns to assist the qualified staff on a daily basis. This also helps to keep the fees as low as possible for the parents.

The Playgroup acquired charitable status in 1986 and is therefore a non profit making organisation. All proceeds are re invested in the up keep of the property and the out door play area, in order to provide a safe and enjoyable environment for the pre-school children who participate in many beneficial activities.

In order to fund activities and materials for the Pre-School, many little fund raising events are held through out the year. This year we held a "Family Waterside Walk" where families and friends walked from Otterspool along the promenade to The Britannia Pub and back again, where we raised over £50. In May two of the Mums ran in the Liverpool Women's 10k raising almost £300 in sponsorship. Other fund raisers have included a table sale, summer fair and sponsored nursery rhymes recital by the children.

Any money raised goes directly back into the Pre-school as other funding is always hard to get.

Pavilion Pre-school has now been going for thirty six years and all going well will continue to go from strength to strength.

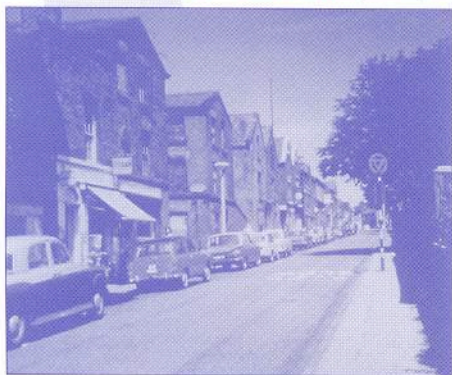

Did You Know?

Did you now that Calderstones Park derived its name from a megalithic tomb which stood on the site. The Calderstones were six sandstone blocks of varying size which originally formed part of a small megalithic tomb, the tumulus of which, together with other stones, was removed early in the nineteenth century.

Axes of the late neolithic period (c.4,500-2,500 B.C.) found in Toxeth, West Derby, Little Woolton, and Wavertree, indicate a measure of land clearance under way. The Calderstones chambered tomb in Allerton is thought to date from the late neolithic/early bronze age and points to a focus of such a population in the area.

SARA WORKING WITH MERSEYSIDE POLICE

Liverpool South Area • Aigburth and Grassendale Neighbourhood • August 2005

Since the last newsletter in April, we have continued to reorganise the area into what we believe will be a more efficient structure. Bob Daly the previous Inspector has moved on to Admiral Street Police Station and I now have responsibility for Allerton Police station. In addition to the Mossley Hill Ward Allerton station has policing responsibility for both Church and Childwall Wards.

The restructuring means that each ward will have three dedicated officers targeting the communities concerns. These officers will be supported by four Community Support Officers (CSO's) on each of the wards. The CSO's are already in place and I would hope you have seen them around the area introducing themselves. They are distinguishable by the blue headbands around their hats.

The officers on the Mossley Hill Ward are:

Constables Kev Flaherty, Alison Jones and Kev Campbell. The CSO's are Karen Sherman, Paul Shelley and Chris Wall.

In the last edition a survey of residents and businesses was mentioned. This survey prioritised your top five issues in relation to crime and disorder and were as follows:

- * Youths hanging around in groups
- * Burglary
- * Speeding vehicles
- * Lack of police visibility
- * Poor Street Lighting

We now have an operation that is ongoing on a Friday and Saturday night to target disorder, which has been successful in reducing the number of complaints in areas traditionally associated with disorder problems. We have run plain clothes operations on Otterspool Promenade, which have resulted in a number of arrests and troublemakers being removed from the area. We will not become complacent over this issue and I would ask to please keep letting us know of any disorder problems near to you.

Burglaries have been reduced following the arrest of two prolific offenders. Please remember during the hot weather we are enjoying at the moment to close all your downstairs windows before going to bed and all your windows before leaving for work. Burglary is an opportunist crime; please don't give thieves an opportunity to target your home.

Speeding vehicles have been addressed in two ways. First of all through speeding campaigns using officers who summons speeding drivers to court or issue on the spot fines. This can be very affective but is not sustainable. I have trained all of our CSO's in the use of the speed gun. While they cannot summons or fine they are writing to the drivers warning them of the consequences of their actions. I can invite anyone to come along and see the initiative and join them for a time while they carry out their work. They will also be joined once a week by police officers that will issue tickets. At the moment we are writing about forty-five letters a week and issuing around twenty fines in your area.

As I mentioned before I hope you will of seen the CSO's working in the area. They are not just providing a visible presence they are also liaising closely with schools and other organisations. Please feel free to stop any that you see and talk with them about their role and any problems you may be having.

Street lighting is being looked at with the local authority. If your lighting has failed you can phone the council directly to have it repaired. If you feel it is inadequate let us know and I will speak with the local authority on your behalf.

If you would like to speak to an officer about anything that is concerning you please call on **777- 5144** and we will arrange to come and meet with you. If it is an emergency always use the 999 number.

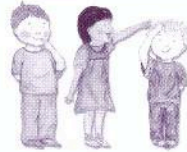
