CHRISTMAS FOOD

An old wives' tale says that bread baked on Christmas Eve never goes mouldy.

The Christmas turkey was imported to France by the Jesuits and is still known in some French dialects as a 'Jesuite'. Christmas pudding originates from an old Celtic dish known as 'frumenty'.

Mince pies should only be eaten between Christmas Eve and Twelfth Night. One should be eaten on every day of the 12 days of Christmas to bring good luck.

It is important to add 3 spices (cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg) to mince pies to represent the three gifts given to the Christ child by the Magi.

A wish should be made whilst eating your first mince pie of the festive season and should always be eaten in silence.

The traditional time for making a Christmas pudding is on STIR UP SUNDAY at the beginning of Advent. A proper Christmas pudding is stirred from East to West in honour of the Magi and traditionally made with 13 ingredients to represent Christ and his disciples.



THE HISTORY OF CHRISTMAS

Father Christmas was originally part of an old English mid-Winter festival. He was dressed in green as a sign of returning Spring. He was known as Sir Christmas, Old Father Christmas or Old Winter. Images of Father Christmas dressed in red started appearing on Christmas cards in the late Victorian times. He is called different names around the world, Santa Claus being the most popular.

SREEPUR VILLAGE ORPHANAGE & WOMEN'S REFUGE

SARA hosted a lecture by Ruby
Porter who described her
work with destitute women
and children in Bangladesh
which deservedly earned her
an MBE. She had first gone to
SreePur Village Orphanage
and Women's Refuge after



seeing a TV documentary about the work being established there by a former British Airways stewardess, Pat Kerr.

As a result of this, in 1990, Ruby had offered embroidery materials for the women to use but had been asked to get involved personally to teach the women — Ruby's profession being a textile teacher. She is currently organising her 31st trip to the project and is a trustee of the village.

She teaches the women embroidery skills so that they can find work in the garment factories. She also brings some of their handicrafts back to sell in the UK.

She vividly described the conditions in which she found herself – "rats as big as cats" and cockroaches nicknamed Cornish pasties by her husband who now accompanies her on her trips.

A heroic woman who is to be commended for her selfless approach to life. It was a humbling experience to hear how very little the women have and the stories of child abandonment would just break your heart. An inspiring story of volunteering, told without self praise and with humour. The event raised £163 for her charity.



THE COLOSSUS OF ROADS

Friday 7th October 2011, saw the welcome return of Norma Walmsley to SARA Hall continuing her stories of her association with the Sultan of Brunei. Norma and her husband Ken (the *diamond*) having retired, decided to spend time travelling in America and Canada and the Royal family provided them with a 42ft Conestoga R.V. for their journey.

Then followed a fascinating talk with pictures, of their next four years travelling the length and breadth of America and parts of Canada.

The trip started in Vancouver, where they collected the R.V but what they expected to be a second honeymoon nearly ended in divorce, due to the *diamond's* refusal to accept that he needed help to manage the massive truck and van. Over the next 24 hours they only moved a few yards! At their first camp they flooded the whole site by turning the waste pipe the wrong way.

They saw lots of Native Americans. Ken knew all the tribes thanks to his boyhood love of comics; they encountered wild animals, including Wolves, Bison and Bears. They parked overnight in National Parks free of charge, after waiting until the Rangers left for the night, but had to leave before they returned in the morning. At times they returned to the UK to see relatives, and check on their home etc., having further adventures on their return to USA. On one occasion they nearly caused an international incident, with Norma's luggage and a dodgy box of Bisto gravy. On another visit they used a Greyhound bus to reach their van, and a very damp journey ensued, caused by a faulty loo!

Norma ended her talk with an update on her Charity work with a Filipino village, on the Island of Mindanao, and as always, left us wanting to hear more.
